Has 25% of Europe's Natural gas reserves. Thermal Energy is however the major source of power for the nation. Additionally, the Netherlands is a leader in wind energy at sea, biomass processing, and greenhouse farming.



❖ Metallurgy

The metallurgy industry is an important part of the manufacturing sector in the Netherlands. Examples of key companies in the country's metallurgy industry include Kapco Hindustan Machine Tools, DMG Mori, Colfax, BTD Manufacturing, Atlas Copco, and Amada.

The chemical industry of the Netherlands is one of the country's leading economic sectors. The country is the headquarters of 19 of the world's leading multinational chemical companies, including Royal Dutch Shell, DSM, AkzoNobel, and BASF.
